



Short Excerpts Taken from Pope Francis' Addresses And Homilies "Give God Space in Prayer"

In the silence of the daily routine, St. Joseph, together with Mary, shares a single common center of attention: Jesus. They accompany and nurture the growth of the Son of God made man for us with commitment and tenderness, reflecting on everything that has happened. In the Gospels, St. Luke twice emphasizes the attitude of Mary, which is also that of St. Joseph: she "kept all these things, pondering them in her heart" (2:19, 51). To listen to the Lord, we must learn to contemplate, feel his constant presence in our lives, and we must stop and converse with him, give him space in prayer. Each of us. . . should ask ourselves, "How much space do I give to the Lord? Do I stop to talk with him?" Ever since we were children, our parents have taught us to start and end the day with a prayer, to teach us to feel that the friendship and the love of God accompany us. Let us remember the Lord more in our daily life!



KID'S CORNER



Charter/Spectrum pulled the plug on WWLP in Berkshire County this past Tuesday into Wednesday night. They did this despite having phone reps in recent weeks assure subscribers there were no such plans. So in effect they did it and lied about doing it.

Parishioners should register their complaints with Charter's Washington office (This is a direct line to a gov. relations person, not a call center 202 621-1923) as well as with your local elected officials who must periodically renew Charter's contract to serve the various communities. The only way for WWLP to return is through actively lobbying of Charter.

In the interim we are establishing contacts with local access channels in the Berkshires to begin carrying Real to Reel (some already carry) and Chalice of Salvation on a regular basis. We hope to start in Pittsfield for the first Sunday of May and build out a make shift network from there. Air times will vary but we are lobbying to ensure the Mass runs sometime Sunday, preferably in the morning.
