Discovering Historic Kennedy Park with Jan Chague

Sunday, September 17, 1:00 PM

Enjoy a moderate hike in the historic Kennedy Park, a Lenox treasure tucked in the middle of town. On a clear day views from the park, elevation 1,460 feet, include New York State, Connecticut and Mount Greylock.

The park is the site of the Aspinwall Hotel, touted as "Hotel Beautiful." Built in 1902, this five-story leviathan burned down in 1931. Tour participants will view remnants of this magnificent expression of early 20th century Lenox. The park's trails meander around a pond and unique rock formations including a balanced rock.

Meet at the parking lot on West Dugway Road (access road to the Pleasant Valley Wildlife Sanctuary, off Route 7/20 north of Lenox). For more information call Jan Chague at 413.637.1818 or 413.441.9971. Come prepared with adequate water and snacks. It's 5 +/- miles and about 3 hours.

Jan Chague is a member of the Lenox Historical Society and recent author of History of Lenox Furnace and Lenox Dale.
