

Two movable containers of live flowers per lot will be allowed from Mother's Day May 10th until Labor Day September 7th. Artificial decorations, shepherd hooks, solar lights, statues, glass containers and containers with prongs are not allowed. The planting of flowers, trees and shrubs is not allowed. Existing trees and shrubs must be trimmed and maintained by lot owners or they will be removed.
