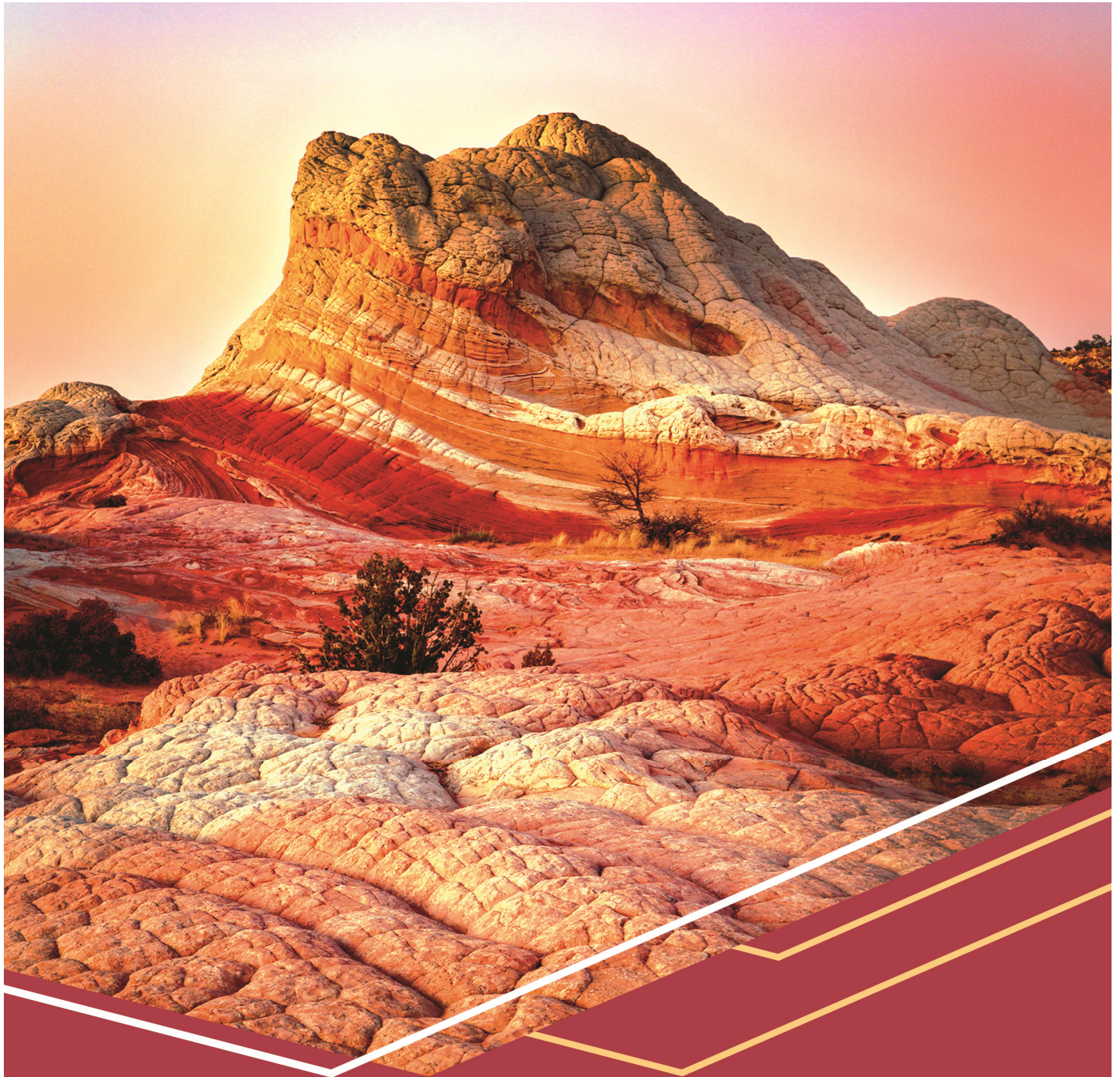

St. Joseph's Cemetery Flower Regulations

Two movable containers of live flowers per lot will be allowed from Mother's Day, May 10th until Labor Day, Sept. 7th. Artificial decorations, shepherd hooks, solar lights, statues, glass containers and containers with prongs are not allowed. The planting of flowers, trees and shrubs is not allowed. Existing trees and shrubs must be trimmed and maintained by lot owners or they will be removed. Decorations are not allowed at the mausoleum. Nothing may be glued, mounted, taped or in anyway affixed to a crypt or niche front, name plaque or any part of the walls. Anything so mounted will be removed and disposed of immediately.

Cemetery gates will be open from 8 AM to 8 PM beginning May 10th.
